Arborvitae	Native evergreen, hardy, grows well in a variety of soils, excellent for screens, hedges, windbreak	12-18"	10 for \$19		
American Elderberry	Native shrub that features fragrant white flowers and bluish-black berries. Great food source for wildlife; berries can be harvest by early fall and make excellent jelly, preserves, pie, & wine; mature height 5-12 feet	12-18"	5 for \$10		
American Redbud	Native, small, flat-topped tree, pink blooms, foliage is large & heart-shaped; yellow fall foliage color; can adapt to different soil conditions, grows best in full sun (mature size is 30 feet in ideal conditions)	12-18"	5 for \$10		
Black Willow	Rooted cuttings; native Swamp Willow of the northeast that is desirable for stream bank retention; tolerant to salt; recommended for wildlife	18-24"	5 for \$10		
Crabapple, Sweet	Also known as American Crabapple (native to the upper two-thirds of the Eastern United States); White flowers. Fruit is red, 1 – 1 1/2 in diameter, bears annually, and is persistent through winter	6-12"	5 for \$10		
Eastern White Pine	Native evergreen, hardy pine, windbreaks, Christmas trees; long, soft needles, grows 75-100 feet in height, can tolerate poorer soils	12-20"	10 for \$19		
Flowering Dogwood	Native; the white flowering dogwood is still one of the most popular of our flowering trees. Early spring = white-petaled flowers; early fall = red berries & beautiful crimson leaves, prefers partial sun	12-18"	5 for \$10		
Ninebark	Hardy; can handle full sun or shade; often used on river-banks; known as a 4-season shrub, white flowers May to June, green coloring in summer, fall color with fruit in September-October; unique exfoliating bark in winter; drought tolerant; provides valuable food to winter wildlife	6-12"	5 for \$10		
Paw Paw	Native, beautiful tree that grows to 15-20 ft. Does well in moist to well drained soils & in shade to full sun. Purple flowers in spring, green leaves& edible fruit in summer, golden leaves in fall	12-18"	5 for \$10		
Persimmon	Native tree; does well in difficult and dry soils. Fragrant white flowers in spring yield orange edible fruit in the fall. Can grow up to 50 feet in height in open conditions.	12-18"	5 for \$10		
Tulip Poplar	Native, hardy, also known as Yellow Poplar; pyramid shaped with light green, glossy leaves, grows 80-100 feet in ideal conditions, hummingbirds enjoy the nectar, Yellow-bellied sapsuckers enjoy the sap, & cardinals enjoy the seeds	12-18"	5 for \$10		
White Spruce	Long-lived, hardy evergreen with short bluish-green needles. Rapid grower in well-drained soils but will be successful in most other soils	12-18"	10 for \$19
